A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In her book, <u>The Fire of Your</u> <u>Life</u>, Maggie Ross recounts the story of Emma, a survivor of the Holocaust, who came each day at 4pm without fail and stood outside a Manhattan church and screamed insults at Jesus at the top of her lungs.

After weeks of this, the pastor, Bishop C. Kilmer Myers, went outside and said to Emma, "Why don't you go inside and tell him?" She disappeared into the church.

An hour went by, and the bishop, worried, decided to look in on her. He found Emma, lying face down before the cross, absolutely still. Reaching down, he touched her shoulder. She looked up with tears streaming down her face and said quietly, "After all, he was a Jew, too."

though Even she was tremendously bitter, through her deep pain having suffered the unspeakable horror of the Holocaust, Emma identified with Christ. may never have She understood why He chose to suffer but she felt His suffering touch her suffering that no one before had been able to touch. In identifying with Christ and

his suffering Emma felt a kind of liberation. The horrible truth of her past was still horribly real but she was free from the unbearable loneliness of her suffering as she found another who had "been there" too -- one who knew what it meant to truly suffer.

March On 6th, Ash Wednesday, we begin the season of Lent. It is a time when we strive to identify with Christ in His suffering in His journey to the cross. As we share His journey I invite you to find time and ways to seek Christ – to identify with Him - both privately in your own spiritual journey and together with others in your church. Through our identifying with Him in His suffering and accepting His suffering on our behalf we, too, are free -- free from suffering alone and free from the penalty of sin as Christ suffered to bear it for US.

Maybe, like Emma, you, too, are suffering even as you read this right now. Maybe you know the deep pain of the loneliness when no one else understands what you have aone through or are still going through: illness; severe watching children your makina poor choices;

failure in a relationship [vour failure, or that of another]; the loss of a loved one in death; you name your suffering.... Tell Christ of your pain. Show Him your wounds and He will show you His scars. Feel the healing comfort as His hands, scarred for your suffering and mine -- as those hands hold you close in your pain. Know that He understands. He has "been there" where you have been and that He comes to free you today.



STEPHEN MINISTRY

"I'd been struggling with some wounds that were pretty intense and needed healing things I didn't want to share with family and friends. But with my Stephen Minister walking next to me, I felt safe and comfortable. So I shared my deepest hurts with her—some really painful things that I feared she might judge me for and that made me wonder if God could possibly love me.

After I told her those things, I was really nervous and dreading her response. I was worried that she would think I was an awful person. But instead, she put her arm around me and said, "I'm sorry you had to go through that."

And that was a turning point for me. To go from fear of judgment to a positive affirmation of care, empathy—and even sorrow for what I'd been through—it was so meaningful. That's when I began to feel God's love again.

The fact that God is invisible makes it hard for me to experience him sometimes. I'd been through some very negative experiences in life that caused me to question whether God even existed—and, if he existed, whether he loved me. I truly wondered, after all the things I'd done and the mess I'd been through, if God could still love me.

What I needed the most was unconditional love—to know that no matter what I shared with her, no matter what I'd done, she cared for me. I experienced God's sorrow and God's compassion and God's love through her care—and it made all the difference for me. It was the tangible expression of God's love in my Stephen Minister that changed my life."

All men of the congregation are invited to share in a hot breakfast at 8:00am before Ralph's presentation.



MONTHLY BOOK CLUB



Join the Monthly Book Club in March as they read and discuss Just Mercy by Bryan Stephenson. A true story, Stevenson was a young lawyer when he founded the Equal Justice Initiative, a legal practice dedicated to defending those most desperate and in need: the poor, the wrongly condemned, and women and children trapped in the farthest reaches of our criminal justice system. One of his first cases was that of Walter McMillian, a young man who was sentenced to die for a notorious murder he insisted he

didn't commit. The case drew Bryan into a tangle of conspiracy, political machination, and legal brinksmanship—and transformed his understanding of mercy and justice forever. Just Mercy is at once an unforgettable account of an idealistic, gifted young lawyer's coming of age, a moving window into the lives of those he has defended, and an inspiring argument for compassion in the pursuit of true justice
